SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, persons are prohibited from 6 possessing certain firearms.

This bill would prohibit persons from possessing a part or combination of parts designed or intended to convert a pistol into a machine gun.

This bill would also provide criminal penalties for violations.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it came within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

39	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
40	term "machine gun" means any weapon which shoots, is
41	designed to shoot, or can be readily restored to shoot,
42	automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading,
43	by a single function of the trigger. The term shall include
44	the frame or receiver of any such weapon, any part designed
45	and intended solely and exclusively, or combination of parts
46	designed and intended, for use in converting a weapon into a
47	machine gun, and any combination of parts from which a
48	machine gun can be assembled if such parts are in the
49	possession or under the control of a person.
50	(b) No person shall knowingly own or have in his or her
51	possession, control, care, or custody a part or combination
52	of parts designed or intended to convert a pistol into a

54	(c) A violation of this section is a Class C felony.
