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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would provide for the recognition of
6	firearm hold agreements between a federal firearm
7	licensee or a municipal or county law enforcement
8	officer and an individual firearm owner where the
9	licensee or law enforcement officer agrees to hold a
10	lawfully possessed firearm for a specified period of
11	time.
12	This bill would also provide civil immunity for
13	a federal firearm licensee or municipal or county law
14	enforcement officer who enters into a lawful firearm
15	hold agreement.

19	TO BE ENTITLED
20	AN ACT
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22	Relating to firearms; to define firearm hold
23	agreements; and to provide civil immunity for federal firearm
24	licensees or municipal or county law enforcement officers who
25	enter into firearm hold agreements under certain conditions.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. (a) This section shall be known as and may
28	be cited as the Houston/Hunter Act.



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(b) For the purposes of this act, the following termshave the following meanings:

31 (1) FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSEE. Any person who is
32 licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Chapter 44.

33 (2) FIREARM. Has the same meaning as provided in 1834 U.S.C. § 921.

(3) FIREARM HOLD AGREEMENT. A private transaction
between a federal firearm licensee or a municipal or county
law enforcement officer and an individual firearm owner where
the licensee or law enforcement officer agrees to: (i) take
physical possession of the owner's lawfully possessed firearm
at the owner's request; (ii) hold the firearm for an agreed
period of time; and (iii) return the firearm to the owner.

42 (c) No individual shall have a cause of action against 43 a federal firearm licensee or municipal or county law 44 enforcement officer operating lawfully in this state for any 45 act or omission arising from a firearm hold agreement which 46 results in personal injury or death of any individual, 47 including the return of any firearm to the individual firearm 48 owner at the termination of a firearm hold agreement.

(d) The immunity from civil liability provided in subsection (c) shall not apply to any action arising from a firearm hold agreement if that action is the result of unlawful conduct on the part of the federal firearm licensee or municipal or county law enforcement officer.

(e) This section shall not apply to firearm transfers
made in violation of Title 13A or Chapter 27 of Title 41, Code
of Alabama 1975.
