A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 5 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia  
2 Annotated, relating to Brady Law Regulations, so as to require a five-day waiting period for  
3 the transfer or purchase of certain firearms; to provide for related matters; to repeal  
4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Part 5 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
8 relating to Brady Law Regulations, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section  
9 16-11-172, relating to transfers or purchases of firearms subject to the NICS, information  
10 concerning persons who have been involuntarily hospitalized to be forwarded to the FBI,  
11 penalties for breach of confidentiality, and exceptions, as follows:

12 "(a) All transfers or purchases of firearms conducted by a licensed importer, licensed  
13 manufacturer, or licensed dealer shall be subject to the NICS; provided, however, that no  
14 firearm shall be transferred or purchased by a licensed dealer until five days after such  
15 transfer or purchase has been subject to the NICS. To the extent possible, the center shall

16 provide to the NICS all necessary criminal history information and wanted person records  
17 in order to complete an NICS check."

18 **SECTION 2.**

19 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
