DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-47-3.5.

Synopsis: Firearm buyback programs. Extends, to political subdivisions, the application of current restrictions on firearm buyback programs. Prohibits a firearm buyback program that does not meet certain requirements related to staffing, serial number searches, firearm disposal, and disclosure of identifying information.

Effective: July 1, 2025.
