13	Preamble
14	WHEREAS, Maryland has a robust business climate; and
15 16	WHEREAS, Retail firearm businesses in Maryland are in need of added security and protection, particularly after business hours; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure retail firearm businesses in the State receive the necessary cooperation and coordination with law enforcement to protect the businesses from burglaries, break—ins, and theft; and
20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, It is therefore the purpose of this bill to reduce firearm theft and increase the safety of the communities by increasing cooperation and coordination with law enforcement and requiring regularly at least one nightly patrol of each retail firearm business after hours within each jurisdiction by county and municipal police departments in the jurisdiction where the retail firearm business is located; now, therefore,



- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Public Safety

- 5 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "RETAIL FIREARM BUSINESS" MEANS A BUSINESS 6 THAT SELLS FIREARMS, INCLUDING REGULATED FIREARMS.
- 7 (B) EACH LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL COLLABORATE WITH 8 EACH RETAIL FIREARM BUSINESS IN THE JURISDICTION OF THE LOCAL LAW 9 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR PROVIDING AT LEAST ONE 10 PATROL BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER EACH NIGHT DURING NONBUSINESS 11 HOURS TO MONITOR AND INSPECT THE RETAIL FIREARM BUSINESS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2020.
