

## Chapter 454

**(House Bill 94)**

AN ACT concerning

**Public Safety – Handgun Permits – Expiration and Renewal Periods for Retired Law Enforcement Officer**

FOR the purpose of establishing alternative expiration and renewal periods for a handgun permit issued to a certain retired law enforcement officer; and generally relating to handgun permits.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – Public Safety**

5–301.

(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(c) “Permit” means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport a handgun.

5–304.

(b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.

(d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:

(2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal corporation of the State.

5-309.

(a) Except as provided in [subsection] **SUBSECTIONS (d) AND (E)** of this section, a permit expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date the permit is issued.

(b) [Subject] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION AND SUBJECT** to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for successive periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this subtitle.

(c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a question of the person's identity.

(d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:

(1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article;

(2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; or

(3) a special police officer under § 3-306 of this article.

**(E) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING FROM SERVICE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:**

**(1) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND**

**(2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, MAY BE RENEWED FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF 5 YEARS EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.**

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2026.
