**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act to prevent gun violence.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2 section 236 the following section:-

3 Section 237. The director shall establish a program for firearm screening and counseling.
4 Such program shall systematically screen all patients for the presence of firearms in the home.
5 The director shall, after consultation with recognized professional medical groups and such other
6 sources as the director deems appropriate, promulgate regulations establishing (1) the means by
7 which and the intervals at which patients shall be screened for the presence of firearms in the
8 home and (2) guidelines for safety counseling for individuals that screen positive for the
9 presence of firearms in the home.

10 SECTION 2. This section shall take effect 6 months after its passage.
