1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 876, Page 2, Section 566.145, Line 27, by
2 inserting after all of said section and line the following:

4 "578.710. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

5 (1) "First responder", any peace officer as defined in section 590.010; paid or volunteer
6 firefighter; uniformed employee of the office of the state fire marshal; emergency medical
7 technician; emergency room, hospital, or trauma center personnel; parole officer; probation officer;
8 state correctional employee; water safety officer; park ranger; conservation officer; air ambulance
9 pilot; air ambulance registered professional nurse; air ambulance registered respiratory therapist; or
10 air ambulance flight crew member;

11 (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.

12 2. A person commits the offense of unlawful posting of personally identifying information
13 over the internet if he or she knowingly posts on the internet the name, home address, Social
14 Security number, telephone number, or other personal information of any first responder on the
15 internet with the intent to cause great bodily harm or death to the first responder or with the intent to
16 threaten great bodily harm or death to the first responder.

17 3. The offense of unlawful posting of personally identifying information over the internet is
18 a class A misdemeanor."; and

20 Further amend said bill, Page 3, Section 590.075, Line 5, by inserting after all of said section and
21 line the following:

23 "590.1265. 1. The provisions of this section shall be known and may be cited as the "Police
24 Use of Force Transparency Act of 2021".

25 2. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

26 (1) "Law enforcement agency", the same meaning as defined in section 590.1040;

27 (2) "Peace officer", the same meaning as defined in section 590.010;

28 (3) "Use-of-force incident", an incident in which:

29 (a) A fatality occurs that is connected to a use of force by a peace officer;

30 (b) Serious bodily injury occurs that is connected to a use of force by a peace officer; or

31 (c) In the absence of death or serious bodily injury, a peace officer discharges a firearm at,
32 or in the direction of, a person.

33 3. Each law enforcement agency shall, at least annually, collect and report local data on use-
34 of-force incidents involving peace officers to the National Use of Force Data Collection through the
35 Law Enforcement Enterprise Portal administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

36 4. Each law enforcement agency shall additionally report the data submitted under

1 subsection 3 of this section to the department of public safety. Law enforcement agencies shall not
2 include personally identifying information of individual peace officers in their reports.

3 5. The department of public safety shall, no later than June 30, 2022, develop standards and
4 procedures governing the collection and reporting of use-of-force data under this section. The
5 standards and procedures shall be consistent with the requirements, definitions, and methods of the
6 National Use of Force Data Collection administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

7 6. The department of public safety shall publish the data reported by law enforcement
8 agencies under subsection 4 of this section, including statewide aggregate data and agency-specific
9 data, in a publicly available report. Such data shall be deemed a public record consistent with the
10 provisions and exemptions contained in chapter 610.

11 7. The department of public safety shall undertake an analysis of any trends and disparities
12 in rates of use of force by all law enforcement agencies, with a report to be released to the public no
13 later than January 1, 2025. The report shall be updated periodically thereafter, but not less than once
14 every five years.

15 Section B. Section 590.1265 of section A of this act shall become effective on January 1,
16 2022."; and

18 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
19 accordingly.
