2 Page 1, Line 27, by deleting said line and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 "(3) For a third or subsequent offense, a class D felony.

5 571.101. 1. All applicants for concealed carry permits issued pursuant to subsection 7 of
6 this section must satisfy the requirements of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the said applicant can
7 show qualification as provided by sections 571.101 to 571.121, the county or city sheriff shall issue
8 a concealed carry permit authorizing the carrying of a concealed firearm on or about the applicant's
9 person or within a vehicle. A concealed carry permit shall be valid from the date of issuance or
10 renewal until five years from the last day of the month in which the permit was issued or renewed.
11 The concealed carry permit is valid throughout this state. Although the permit is considered valid in
12 the state, a person who fails to renew his or her permit within five years from the date of issuance or
13 renewal shall not be eligible for an exception to a National Instant Criminal Background Check
14 under federal regulations currently codified under 27 CFR 478.102(d), relating to the transfer, sale,
15 or delivery of firearms from licensed dealers. A concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August
16 28, 2013, shall continue from the date of issuance or renewal until three years from the last day of
17 the month in which the endorsement was issued or renewed to authorize the carrying of a concealed
18 firearm on or about the applicant's person or within a vehicle in the same manner as a concealed
19 carry permit issued under subsection 7 of this section on or after August 28, 2013.

20 2. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to subsection 7 of this section shall be issued by
21 the sheriff or his or her designee of the county or city in which the applicant resides, if the applicant:

22 (1) Is at least ~~nineteen~~ eighteen years of age, is a citizen or permanent resident of the
23 United States and either:

24 (a) Has assumed residency in this state; or

25 (b) Is a member of the United States Armed Forces stationed in Missouri~~;~~ or the spouse of
26 such member of the military;

 15 involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

 17 Armed Forces;

 19 that causes the sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant presents a danger to himself or
 20 others;

21 ~~[(8)]~~ (7) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five years
 22 prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health facility, as defined in section
 23 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state following a hearing at which the defendant
 24 was represented by counsel or a representative;

25 ~~[(9)]~~ (8) Submits a completed application for a permit as described in subsection 3 of this
 26 section;

27 ~~[(10)]~~ (9) Submits an affidavit attesting that the applicant complies with the concealed carry
 28 safety training requirement pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 of section 571.111;

29 ~~[(11)]~~ (10) Is not the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;
 30 and

31 ~~[(12)]~~ (11) Is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm under section 571.070 or
 32 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g).

33 3. The application for a concealed carry permit issued by the sheriff of the county of the
 34 applicant's residence shall contain only the following information:

35 (1) The applicant's name, address, telephone number, gender, date and place of birth, and, if
 36 the applicant is not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of citizenship and any alien or
 37 admission number issued by the Federal Bureau of Customs and Immigration Enforcement or any
 38 successor agency;

39 (2) An affirmation that the applicant has assumed residency in Missouri or is a member of
 40 the Armed Forces stationed in Missouri or the spouse of such a member of the Armed Forces and is
 41 a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;

42 (3) An affirmation that the applicant is at least ~~[nineteen]~~ eighteen years of age ~~[or is~~
 43 ~~eighteen years of age or older and a member of the United States Armed Forces or honorably~~
 44 ~~discharged from the United States Armed Forces]~~;

45 (4) An affirmation that the applicant has not pled guilty to or been convicted of a crime
 46 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the
 47 United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
 48 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
 49 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

1 (5) An affirmation that the applicant has not been convicted of, pled guilty to, or entered a
2 plea of nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a
3 five-year period immediately preceding application for a permit or if the applicant has not been
4 convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the influence of
5 intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance within a five-year
6 period immediately preceding application for a permit;

7 (6) An affirmation that the applicant is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an
8 information or indictment with the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term
9 exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the United States other than a crime classified
10 as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two
11 years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

12 (7) An affirmation that the applicant has not been discharged under dishonorable conditions
13 from the United States Armed Forces;

14 (8) An affirmation that the applicant is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of
15 application or for five years prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health
16 facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state, except that a
17 person whose release or discharge from a facility in this state pursuant to chapter 632, or a similar
18 discharge from a facility in another state, occurred more than five years ago without subsequent
19 recommitment may apply;

20 (9) An affirmation that the applicant has received firearms safety training that meets the
21 standards of applicant firearms safety training defined in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111;

22 (10) An affirmation that the applicant, to the applicant's best knowledge and belief, is not
23 the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

24 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made by the applicant will result in
25 prosecution for perjury pursuant to the laws of the state of Missouri; and

26 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This photograph shall not be included on
27 the permit and shall only be used to verify the person's identity for permit renewal, or for the
28 issuance of a new permit due to change of address, or for a lost or destroyed permit.

29 4. An application for a concealed carry permit shall be made to the sheriff of the county or
30 any city not within a county in which the applicant resides. An application shall be filed in writing,
31 signed under oath and under the penalties of perjury, and shall state whether the applicant complies
32 with each of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section. In addition to the completed
33 application, the applicant for a concealed carry permit must also submit the following:

34 (1) A photocopy of a firearms safety training certificate of completion or other evidence of
35 completion of a firearms safety training course that meets the standards established in subsection 1
36 or 2 of section 571.111; and

37 (2) A nonrefundable permit fee as provided by subsection 11 or 12 of this section.

38 5. (1) Before an application for a concealed carry permit is approved, the sheriff shall make
39 only such inquiries as he or she deems necessary into the accuracy of the statements made in the
40 application. The sheriff may require that the applicant display a Missouri driver's license or
41 nondriver's license or military identification and orders showing the person being stationed in
42 Missouri. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a concealed carry permit, the applicant
43 shall be fingerprinted. No other biometric data shall be collected from the applicant. The sheriff
44 shall conduct an inquiry of the National Instant Criminal Background Check System within three
45 working days after submission of the properly completed application for a concealed carry permit.
46 If no disqualifying record is identified by these checks at the state level, the fingerprints shall be
47 forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. Upon
48 receipt of the completed report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System and
49 the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history record check, the

1 sheriff shall examine the results and, if no disqualifying information is identified, shall issue a
2 concealed carry permit within three working days.

3 (2) In the event the report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System
4 and the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history record check
5 prescribed by subdivision (1) of this subsection are not completed within forty-five calendar days
6 and no disqualifying information concerning the applicant has otherwise come to the sheriff's
7 attention, the sheriff shall issue a provisional permit, clearly designated on the certificate as such,
8 which the applicant shall sign in the presence of the sheriff or the sheriff's designee. This permit,
9 when carried with a valid Missouri driver's or nondriver's license or a valid military identification,
10 shall permit the applicant to exercise the same rights in accordance with the same conditions as
11 pertain to a concealed carry permit issued under this section, provided that it shall not serve as an
12 alternative to an national instant criminal background check required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t).
13 The provisional permit shall remain valid until such time as the sheriff either issues or denies the
14 certificate of qualification under subsection 6 or 7 of this section. The sheriff shall revoke a
15 provisional permit issued under this subsection within twenty-four hours of receipt of any report that
16 identifies a disqualifying record, and shall notify the concealed carry permit system established
17 under subsection 5 of section 650.350. The revocation of a provisional permit issued under this
18 section shall be proscribed in a manner consistent to the denial and review of an application under
19 subsection 6 of this section.

20 6. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application for a concealed carry permit if he or she
21 determines that any of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section have not been met,
22 or if he or she has a substantial and demonstrable reason to believe that the applicant has rendered a
23 false statement regarding any of the provisions of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the applicant is
24 found to be ineligible, the sheriff is required to deny the application, and notify the applicant in
25 writing, stating the grounds for denial and informing the applicant of the right to submit, within
26 thirty days, any additional documentation relating to the grounds of the denial. Upon receiving any
27 additional documentation, the sheriff shall reconsider his or her decision and inform the applicant
28 within thirty days of the result of the reconsideration. The applicant shall further be informed in
29 writing of the right to appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.
30 After two additional reviews and denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the application shall
31 appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.

32 7. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall issue a concealed carry permit to the
33 applicant within a period not to exceed three working days after his or her approval of the
34 application. The applicant shall sign the concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff or his
35 or her designee.

36 8. The concealed carry permit shall specify only the following information:

- 37 (1) Name, address, date of birth, gender, height, weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and
38 signature of the permit holder;
39 (2) The signature of the sheriff issuing the permit;
40 (3) The date of issuance; and
41 (4) The expiration date.
42

43 The permit shall be no larger than two and one-eighth inches wide by three and three-eighths inches
44 long and shall be of a uniform style prescribed by the department of public safety. The permit shall
45 also be assigned a concealed carry permit system county code and shall be stored in sequential
46 number.

47 9. (1) The sheriff shall keep a record of all applications for a concealed carry permit or a
48 provisional permit and his or her action thereon. Any record of an application that is incomplete or
49 denied for any reason shall be kept for a period not to exceed one year. Any record of an application

1 that was approved shall be kept for a period of one year after the expiration and nonrenewal of the
2 permit.

3 (2) The sheriff shall report the issuance of a concealed carry permit or provisional permit to
4 the concealed carry permit system. All information on any such permit that is protected information
5 on any driver's or nondriver's license shall have the same personal protection for purposes of
6 sections 571.101 to 571.121. An applicant's status as a holder of a concealed carry permit,
7 provisional permit, or a concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, shall not be
8 public information and shall be considered personal protected information. Information retained in
9 the concealed carry permit system under this subsection shall not be distributed to any federal, state,
10 or private entities and shall only be made available for a single entry query of an individual in the
11 event the individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal investigation or is arrested for a
12 crime. A sheriff may access the concealed carry permit system for administrative purposes to issue
13 a permit, verify the accuracy of permit holder information, change the name or address of a permit
14 holder, suspend or revoke a permit, cancel an expired permit, or cancel a permit upon receipt of a
15 certified death certificate for the permit holder. Any person who violates the provisions of this
16 subdivision by disclosing protected information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

17 10. Information regarding any holder of a concealed carry permit, or a concealed carry
18 endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, is a closed record. No bulk download or batch data
19 shall be distributed to any federal, state, or private entity, except to MoSMART or a designee
20 thereof. Any state agency that has retained any documents or records, including fingerprint records
21 provided by an applicant for a concealed carry endorsement prior to August 28, 2013, shall destroy
22 such documents or records, upon successful issuance of a permit.

23 11. For processing an application for a concealed carry permit pursuant to sections 571.101
24 to 571.121, the sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed one hundred
25 dollars which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.
26 This fee shall include the cost to reimburse the Missouri state highway patrol for the costs of
27 fingerprinting and criminal background checks. An additional fee shall be added to each credit card,
28 debit card, or other electronic transaction equal to the charge paid by the state or the applicant for
29 the use of the credit card, debit card, or other electronic payment method by the applicant.

30 12. For processing a renewal for a concealed carry permit pursuant to sections 571.101 to
31 571.121, the sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed fifty dollars
32 which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.

33 13. For the purposes of sections 571.101 to 571.121, the term "sheriff" shall include the
34 sheriff of any county or city not within a county or his or her designee and in counties of the first
35 classification the sheriff may designate the chief of police of any city, town, or municipality within
36 such county.

37 14. For the purposes of this chapter, "concealed carry permit" shall include any concealed
38 carry endorsement issued by the department of revenue before January 1, 2014, and any concealed
39 carry document issued by any sheriff or under the authority of any sheriff after December 31, 2013.

40 571.107. 1. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121, a
41 valid concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, or a concealed carry
42 endorsement or permit issued by another state or political subdivision of another state shall
43 authorize the person in whose name the permit or endorsement is issued to carry concealed firearms
44 on or about his or her person or vehicle throughout the state. No concealed carry permit issued
45 pursuant to sections 571.101 to 571.121, valid concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August
46 28, 2013, or a concealed carry endorsement or permit issued by another state or political subdivision
47 of another state shall authorize any person to carry concealed firearms into:

48 (1) Any police, sheriff, or highway patrol office or station without the consent of the chief
49 law enforcement officer in charge of that office or station. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on

1 the premises of the office or station shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not
2 removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises;

3 (2) Within twenty-five feet of any polling place on any election day. Possession of a firearm
4 in a vehicle on the premises of the polling place shall not be a criminal offense so long as the
5 firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises;

6 (3) The facility of any adult or juvenile detention or correctional institution, prison or jail.
7 Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises of any adult, juvenile detention, or correctional
8 institution, prison or jail shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not removed from
9 the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises;

10 (4) Any courthouse solely occupied by the circuit, appellate or supreme court, or any
11 courtrooms, administrative offices, libraries or other rooms of any such court whether or not such
12 court solely occupies the building in question. This subdivision shall also include, but not be
13 limited to, any juvenile, family, drug, or other court offices, any room or office wherein any of the
14 courts or offices listed in this subdivision are temporarily conducting any business within the
15 jurisdiction of such courts or offices, and such other locations in such manner as may be specified
16 by supreme court rule pursuant to subdivision (6) of this subsection. Nothing in this subdivision
17 shall preclude those persons listed in subdivision (1) of subsection 2 of section 571.030 while within
18 their jurisdiction and on duty, those persons listed in subdivisions (2), (4), and (10) of subsection 2
19 of section 571.030, or such other persons who serve in a law enforcement capacity for a court as
20 may be specified by supreme court rule pursuant to subdivision (6) of this subsection from carrying
21 a concealed firearm within any of the areas described in this subdivision. Possession of a firearm in
22 a vehicle on the premises of any of the areas listed in this subdivision shall not be a criminal offense
23 so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the
24 premises;

25 (5) Any meeting of the governing body of a unit of local government; or any meeting of the
26 general assembly or a committee of the general assembly, except that nothing in this subdivision
27 shall preclude a member of the body holding a valid concealed carry permit or endorsement from
28 carrying a concealed firearm at a meeting of the body which he or she is a member. Possession of a
29 firearm in a vehicle on the premises shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not
30 removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises. Nothing in this
31 subdivision shall preclude a member of the general assembly, a full-time employee of the general
32 assembly employed under Section 17, Article III, Constitution of Missouri, legislative employees of
33 the general assembly as determined under section 21.155, or statewide elected officials and their
34 employees, holding a valid concealed carry permit or endorsement, from carrying a concealed
35 firearm in the state capitol building or at a meeting whether of the full body of a house of the
36 general assembly or a committee thereof, that is held in the state capitol building;

37 (6) The general assembly, supreme court, county or municipality may by rule,
38 administrative regulation, or ordinance prohibit or limit the carrying of concealed firearms by permit
39 or endorsement holders in that portion of a building owned, leased or controlled by that unit of
40 government. Any portion of a building in which the carrying of concealed firearms is prohibited or
41 limited shall be clearly identified by signs posted at the entrance to the restricted area. The statute,
42 rule or ordinance shall exempt any building used for public housing by private persons, highways or
43 rest areas, firing ranges, and private dwellings owned, leased, or controlled by that unit of
44 government from any restriction on the carrying or possession of a firearm. The statute, rule or
45 ordinance shall not specify any criminal penalty for its violation but may specify that persons
46 violating the statute, rule or ordinance may be denied entrance to the building, ordered to leave the
47 building and if employees of the unit of government, be subjected to disciplinary measures for
48 violation of the provisions of the statute, rule or ordinance. The provisions of this subdivision shall
49 not apply to any other unit of government;

1 (7) Any establishment licensed to dispense intoxicating liquor for consumption on the
2 premises, which portion is primarily devoted to that purpose, without the consent of the owner or
3 manager. The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to the licensee of said establishment.
4 The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to any bona fide restaurant open to the general
5 public having dining facilities for not less than fifty persons and that receives at least fifty-one
6 percent of its gross annual income from the dining facilities by the sale of food. This subdivision
7 does not prohibit the possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises of the establishment and
8 shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished
9 while the vehicle is on the premises. Nothing in this subdivision authorizes any individual who has
10 been issued a concealed carry permit or endorsement to possess any firearm while intoxicated;

11 (8) Any area of an airport to which access is controlled by the inspection of persons and
12 property. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises of the airport shall not be a criminal
13 offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on
14 the premises;

15 (9) Any place where the carrying of a firearm is prohibited by federal law;

16 (10) Any higher education institution or elementary or secondary school facility without the
17 consent of the governing body of the higher education institution or a school official or the district
18 school board, unless the person with the concealed carry endorsement or permit is a teacher or
19 administrator of an elementary or secondary school who has been designated by his or her school
20 district as a school protection officer and is carrying a firearm in a school within that district, in
21 which case no consent is required. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises of any
22 higher education institution or elementary or secondary school facility shall not be a criminal
23 offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on
24 the premises;

25 (11) Any portion of a building used as a child care facility without the consent of the
26 manager. Nothing in this subdivision shall prevent the operator of a child care facility in a family
27 home from owning or possessing a firearm or a concealed carry permit or endorsement;

28 (12) Any riverboat gambling operation accessible by the public without the consent of the
29 owner or manager pursuant to rules promulgated by the gaming commission. Possession of a
30 firearm in a vehicle on the premises of a riverboat gambling operation shall not be a criminal
31 offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on
32 the premises;

33 (13) Any gated area of an amusement park. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the
34 premises of the amusement park shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not
35 removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises;

36 ~~(14) [Any church or other place of religious worship without the consent of the minister or~~
37 ~~person or persons representing the religious organization that exercises control over the place of~~
38 ~~religious worship. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises shall not be a criminal~~
39 ~~offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on~~
40 ~~the premises;~~

41 ~~————(15)]~~ Any private property whose owner has posted the premises as being off-limits to
42 concealed firearms by means of one or more signs displayed in a conspicuous place of a minimum
43 size of eleven inches by fourteen inches with the writing thereon in letters of not less than one inch.
44 The owner, business or commercial lessee, manager of a private business enterprise, or any other
45 organization, entity, or person may prohibit persons holding a concealed carry permit or
46 endorsement from carrying concealed firearms on the premises and may prohibit employees, not
47 authorized by the employer, holding a concealed carry permit or endorsement from carrying
48 concealed firearms on the property of the employer. If the building or the premises are open to the
49 public, the employer of the business enterprise shall post signs on or about the premises if carrying a

1 concealed firearm is prohibited. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises shall not be a
2 criminal offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the
3 vehicle is on the premises. An employer may prohibit employees or other persons holding a
4 concealed carry permit or endorsement from carrying a concealed firearm in vehicles owned by the
5 employer;

6 ~~[(16)]~~ (15) Any sports arena or stadium with a seating capacity of five thousand or more.
7 Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the premises shall not be a criminal offense so long as the
8 firearm is not removed from the vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises;

9 ~~[(17)]~~ (16) Any hospital accessible by the public. Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on the
10 premises of a hospital shall not be a criminal offense so long as the firearm is not removed from the
11 vehicle or brandished while the vehicle is on the premises.

12 2. Carrying of a concealed firearm in a location specified in subdivisions (1) to (17) of
13 subsection 1 of this section by any individual who holds a concealed carry permit issued pursuant to
14 sections 571.101 to 571.121, or a concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013,
15 shall not be a criminal act but may subject the person to denial to the premises or removal from the
16 premises. If such person refuses to leave the premises and a peace officer is summoned, such person
17 may be issued a citation for an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars for the first offense. If a
18 second citation for a similar violation occurs within a six-month period, such person shall be fined
19 an amount not to exceed two hundred dollars and his or her permit, and, if applicable, endorsement
20 to carry concealed firearms shall be suspended for a period of one year. If a third citation for a
21 similar violation is issued within one year of the first citation, such person shall be fined an amount
22 not to exceed five hundred dollars and shall have his or her concealed carry permit, and, if
23 applicable, endorsement revoked and such person shall not be eligible for a concealed carry permit
24 for a period of three years. Upon conviction of charges arising from a citation issued pursuant to
25 this subsection, the court shall notify the sheriff of the county which issued the concealed carry
26 permit, or, if the person is a holder of a concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28,
27 2013, the court shall notify the sheriff of the county which issued the certificate of qualification for a
28 concealed carry endorsement and the department of revenue. The sheriff shall suspend or revoke
29 the concealed carry permit or, if applicable, the certificate of qualification for a concealed carry
30 endorsement. If the person holds an endorsement, the department of revenue shall issue a notice of
31 such suspension or revocation of the concealed carry endorsement and take action to remove the
32 concealed carry endorsement from the individual's driving record. The director of revenue shall
33 notify the licensee that he or she must apply for a new license pursuant to chapter 302 which does
34 not contain such endorsement. The notice issued by the department of revenue shall be mailed to
35 the last known address shown on the individual's driving record. The notice is deemed received
36 three days after mailing."; and"; and
