- 27 (a) "Firearm" means the same as that term is defined in Section 76-10-501.
- 28 (b) "On or about school premises" means the same as that term is defined in Section

30	(2) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
31	state board shall make rules that establish minimum standards for firearm safety
32	instruction as described in Subsection (4).
33	(3) An LEA shall, in accordance with the minimum standards established under Subsection
34	(2), provide an instructional session on firearm safety to all students in the grade levels
35	described in Subsection (4).
36	(4) An LEA shall present firearm safety instruction:
37	(a) to every student, once per school year, from kindergarten through grade 6;
38	(b) to every student, at least once, while the student is attending middle school and at
39	least once while the student is attending high school;
40	(c) in a manner that is developmentally appropriate to the grade level receiving the
41	instruction; and
42	(d) emphasizing the best practices and guidelines for the safe handling and storage of a
43	firearm to prevent accidents and ensure personal safety.
44	(5) An LEA providing the instruction described in Subsection (4):
45	(a) may provide the instruction:
46	(i) in a public school using live instruction, a video, or online materials;
47	(ii) with an existing hunter safety course; or
48	(iii) with physical education curriculum; and
49	(b) shall ensure that any statement regarding a firearm is politically neutral.
50	(6) A school providing the instruction described in Subsection (4) shall create and
51	implement curricula and activities:
52	(a) in accordance with the minimum standards the state board establishes under

54	(b) that provide a thorough explanation of firearm safety and principles including:
55	(i) understanding that a firearm is not a toy;
56	(ii) recognizing that a firearm can be dangerous and that special rules exist to ensure

58	(iii) knowing to stop and leave a firearm alone when encountering a firearm;
59	(iv) educating others about firearm safety;
60	(v) telling an adult upon finding or observing a firearm; and
61	(vi) reporting threats involving a firearm with the appropriate authorities.
62	(7) If a firearm safety instruction under this section entails the display or functionality of an

63	actual firearm on or about school premises, the individual who provides the firearm
64	safety instruction shall:
65	(a) have a concealed carry permit issued under Section 53-5-704;
66	(b) have a temporary concealed permit issued under Section 53-5-705; or
67	(c) be a person exempt from certain weapons laws as described in Subsection
68	76-10-523(1)(a) through (f).
69	(8) An individual providing firearm safety instruction under Subsection (6) is not required
70	to conceal the firearm during the firearm safety instruction if the individual is otherwise
71	required to conceal the firearm under another state or federal law while on or about
72	school premises.
73	(9)(a) A school shall, before providing firearm safety instruction, notify a student's
74	parent or legal guardian of the instruction and provide details on how to opt out.
75	(b) A school shall provide an alternative educational activity to a student whose parent
76	or legal guardian opts the student out of firearm safety instruction.
77	Section 2. Effective Date.
